Parent Open Afternoon & Sausage Sizzle

On Tuesday 10th March (Week 6) starting at 4.30pm we will be holding our Parent Open afternoon. Mr. Simpson and Ms Dewson Hall will be discussing some of the whole school focuses for 2020 in the Library and then at 5.00pm Classroom teachers will have their classrooms open to informally discuss classroom routines and expectations. Parents will have opportunities to ask questions, get familiar with your child's year ahead and see their progress so far. A Sausage Sizzle will be provided in the new undercover area from 6.00pm. Looking forward to seeing you then.

Homework

All classes will be providing homework in 2020, which I hope you would have received by the end of Week 2. All classes homework will be a combination of Reading, Spelling and Maths. Teachers will provide you with information on their individual classrooms expectations. Any assistance you provide in helping with your children's homework is greatly appreciated.

Rocket Readers Club



I hope by now you would have received some information in regards to our new Rocket Readers Club. All students have been provided with a Rocket Reader log book to keep track of any reading they are doing at home. For every 15 minutes signed off by a parent, carer, older sibling or teacher, student's will receive a Rocket Reader Dojo. Students will be recognised every 20 times they have read at home by receiving a Rocket Readers certificate at assemblies. I'm looking forward to keeping you informed of our home reading progress.

Building a Love of Reading

In support of your child's Reading skills here are some suggestions for parents from the Education Department. Reading is a skill that is learnt, and needs to be practised. As a parent, you can support your child by helping them read at home.

Here are some great ideas for reading at home as a family.

- Have a special place at home to keep books and other reading materials.
- Encourage your child to choose what they would like to read.
 Be positive about their choices.
- Let your child see you reading for enjoyment and to learn.
- Share your reading choices with your child and tell them why you have chosen a particular book or article; what you are reading and what it is making you think about.
- Encourage your child to set aside a regular time for reading each day. Model this yourself so
 your child sees you as a reader.
- Be interested in what your child is reading, and ask them to recommend books for you to read.
- Visit the local library regularly so your child can browse the huge range of reading materials, and ask the librarian for recommendations.
- Encourage your child to find things to read about their favourite topics. Explore together different formats such as audio books and graphic novels.
- Try out books in a series. If your child gets 'hooked' by the first book, they are more likely to continue reading the series.
- Monitor access to a computer or device, either at home or in the local library so that your child can use the internet.
- Buy books as gifts.
- Swap and share books with family and friends.
- Ask others about what they are reading.

Support what is happening at school

Your children will be reading lots of things at school. Here's how you can tap into what is happening at school.

- Listen to your child read, fill out the Rocket Reader Log book and talk to your child about the book they are reading.
- Go to class meetings offered by the teacher so you know what the children are learning in different learning areas.
- Talk with the teacher individually about what you can do to help your child.
- Ask your child about the book they have taken out of the school library, for example "Why did you choose that book?" and "Is it what you thought it was going to be?"
- Show an interest in work your child may do at home on projects or research.


Newman's Own sponsorships are \$2,100 each. The balance of \$250 will be payable by the applicant. A \$150 travel allowance is also provided for successful applicants.
