Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Well the end of term is almost upon us and what a wonderful term it has been. We've competed in our own **Faction Athletics Carnival**, as well as the **Interschool Athletics Carnival**. Our Primary students won the Shield, and our secondary students competed to a very high standard. We also celebrated **RU OK Day**, which was well attended. We had **Pirate Day** raising money for research into childhood cancer. As a school, we raised \$104 which is a fantastic achievement. Our **ORACY** performances were just outstanding earlier in the term. This gave students a wonderful opportunity to speak and perform in front of their classes. Our **5/6's** had a great **camp to Dwellingup** which was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who attended. Reading some of the reports from students on their return was exhausting enough! The camps organisation and supervision is a credit to Miss Carlshausen, Mr. McIntyre and Miss Symonds. Our final assembly for the term, saw an item performed from our 2/3's in Room 1, which was absolutely tremendous. I have really enjoyed Term 3 and I'm looking forward to more of the same in Term 4.

## **Junior Cricket**

Cricket Training will be starting the first week of next term. The first training session will be on Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup> of October straight after school. We have our first game that weekend in Quairading on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup>. All training sessions after that will be on Friday Afternoons after school.

## **Pump Track Opening**

The Shire's new Pump Track will be opening on Friday the 16<sup>th</sup> of Oct at 4.00pm. The P&C and the Noongar youth group will be running a sausage sizzle at the opening. We will be announcing in the first week back at school which students have won the donated reconditioned bikes and helmets as well.



## **Student Free Day**

Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> of October is a student free day at Brookton DHS. We will be conducting some professional learning for Staff. Students first day next term is Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup> of October.

## **The Centre for Excellence in the Explicit teaching of Literacy (CEETL)**

Miss Carlshausen and myself attended CEETL in Week 3 of this term. The week involved seminars at Curtin University and school visits to Wattle Grove Primary, Ballajura Primary, Calista Primary and Kingston Primary in Bunbury. It provided an opportunity to see best teaching practice in action, and to see how top performing schools use an Explicit Teaching approach. Miss Carlshausen and I have come back to school with great enthusiasm and drive to see that our teaching and learning program is absolutely on the right track at Brookton. We presented our findings to staff and have worked to implement the Reading Warmup in our literacy blocks this term. Miss Carlshausen has taken on a coaching role to support staff with new and engaging ideas to include in their warm-ups. I have presented to staff on the areas we want covered in our reading warm-ups. We have also sent a team of teachers to our partner school Calista Primary. Mr McIntyre, Miss Fiori and Miss Dewson Hall all spent a day in classrooms watching lessons and then having a one-on-one session with Calista's Deputy Principal to talk about teacher planning and tips to getting Explicit Teaching happening in the classroom. The CEETL team will be visiting us in the last week of term to support us with our progress and see teachers work in action. All in all, the start of our participation in this year long program has been very encouraging.

## **Staffing News**

We have completed our 0.33 FTE cleaners process and Miss Tomisha Ware has been appointed as the successful applicant. We wish her well in her new role at Brookton and look forward to her being part of the team.

We have also completed our 0.4 FTE Library Resource Officers position and Ms Charlene Hayden has been appointed as the successful applicant. We now have Charlene three days a week as part of our school team which we are thrilled about.

I'd also like to inform the school community that Jayden Bennell has been appointed the new Brookton Aquatic Centre Manager for the shire starting fulltime in Week 2 next term. This is a wonderful opportunity for Jayden and his family, and I'm sure you will join me in congratulating him on his achievement. Jayden will leave very large shoes to fill at Brookton DHS. His dedication to the role of AIEO in his time here has been outstanding. The families of Brookton thank you for your tireless work in looking after the wellbeing of all of our students, but in particular our Aboriginal Students. Congratulations Jayden again from all of us here at Brookton DHS. We wish you the very best.



### **Ngala Koolangka Kaadadjin Project**

I'm very excited to announce the start of the Ngala Koolangka Kaadadjin (Our Children's Learning) Project at Brookton DHS. This pilot project has been presented to our admin team by Ms Donnelle Slater and will also involve working closely with Seabrook Aboriginal Corporation. Donnelle has worked in Aboriginal Education for over 24 years and is long term member of the Student Services Team at Balga Senior High School, and is a parent volunteer with Brookton DHS this year. The project looks at the collection of Aboriginal student data on attendance and academic results, analysing areas of concern and working closely with teachers and families to create individual learning plans (ILPs), monitoring student academic progress. Over the next 2 years we hope to incorporate Aboriginal Culture, Health & Well-Being, Attendance and Extracurricular activity and all of the elements of the Aboriginal Cultural Standards Framework. Donnelle will work closely with our teaching staff, to analyse student data and liaise with Aboriginal families and Seabrook Aboriginal Corporation. We have representatives from most Aboriginal families signed up, and we look forward to working with Donnelle on this very exciting project.

Thank you to everyone for your continued support of Brookton DHS. I hope our students will have a safe and enjoyable holiday break and we will see you all back on **Tuesday the 13th of October** for day 1 next term.
