Principals Address

In Term 2 we had a strong focus on music and the arts, an area that not only fosters creativity but also supports the development of emotional regulation, positive relationships, and student engagement, all central to the Berry Street Education Model. Our trial music program was a tremendous success. Mrs McCabe spoke highly of our students noting their enthusiasm, respectful behaviour, and active engagement. As a principal, this feedback fills me with pride. Mrs McCabe was so uplifted by the experience that she is already exploring the idea of bringing the next pantomime to Brookton, and hopes our students will once again take part. And, in Term 3 she commences private music lessons for those students who have been inspired to take up music. Students also had the opportunity to attend and participate in a performance and workshop with Spare Parts Puppet Theatre. They not only enjoyed the show but created their own puppets - thanks to the generous support of our P&C, who covered the cost for all students from Pre-Primary to Year 6. What a wonderful way to support student engagement and joy in learning!

We welcomed Ms Amber Nicholls to run songwriting workshops while our teachers conducted parent interviews. These experiences broaden our students' exposure to the arts and allow them to connect learning with creative expression, a key strategy in fostering engagement and building relational trust.

One parent helper shared a moment that truly touched my heart, witnessing how inclusive and patient our students were with her child who has special needs. We couldn't ask for a more powerful reflection of our Positive Behaviour Support framework in action.

Exciting news in the holidays, 12 of our students were selected to play Auskick during half-time at the Fremantle Dockers game over the holidays! I was lucky to be there cheering them on (and of course, cheering for the Dockers). Looking ahead to Term 3, we are excited to launch two trial projects that strengthen our support for all learners. Mr Sheridan will take on a new role as Complex Behaviour Support Teacher – further embedding trauma-informed practices across the school. Mrs MacInnes will expand her literacy support through the Small Group Tutorial Project. As part of these changes, we are thrilled to welcome two new staff: Ms Kaitlyn Elsegood, who will teach High School Art, and Ms Madeleine Christie, who will be taking on additional Health teaching responsibilities and covering Mrs Duggan's maternity leave. Term 3 is another busy term with Science Fair, Oracy assessments of public speaking and Athletics Carnivals. The long jump practice has already commenced and no doubt we will see the flag races set up on the oval for practices soon too. We are hosting our first Year 6 Orientation Morning to High School on Monday 11th August. Students will be able to sample outdoor education, beauty therapy, woodwork and home economics. We are looking forward to a fun morning.
